Hurricane Update

- The storm is very slow moving 6mph and continues to wobble...once advisory puts the track to the east and out to see and the next is back to the west. Please be patient and continue to monitor the storm.
- Once Matthew moves near the southeastern Bahamas on Wednesday, it is forecast to turn northwestward or north-northwestward.
- The model guidance is in relatively good agreement through 72 hours, but begin to diverge by days 4 and 5.
- It is important to remind users that <u>average NHC track</u> forecast errors are around 175 miles at day 4 and 230 miles at day 5.

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


Hurricane MATTHEW – 3 October 2016 – 5:30 AM

<u>Situation Overview</u> National Hurricane Center (NHC) Information – 3 October 0500

- Strength: Category 4 (Major Hurricane)
- Current Location and Speed:
 - 290 miles SW of Port Au Prince, Haiti
 - 230 miles SSE of Kingston, Jamaica
 - Moving N at 6 mph

• Winds:

- 130 maximum sustained
- 30 mile radius for hurricane force winds (74 mph)
- 195 mile radius for tropical storm force winds (39 mph)

Current and Projected Impacts

- Current Watches and Warnings:
 - Hurricane Warning: Jamaica, Haiti, portions of Cuba, and Southeastern Bahamas
 - Hurricane Watch: Portions of Cuba, Central Bahamas, and Turks and Caicos Islands
 - Tropical Storm Warning & Watch: Dominican Republic
- Hazards (Projected):

Rainfall:

- 15-20 inches in Haiti (localized up to 40 inches)
- 8-12 inches in Cuba (localized up to 20 inches)
- 2-5 inches in rest of Caribbean (localized up to 8 inches)
- Storm Surge: Up to 15 feet in the Bahamas but highly dependent on timing of storm and tidal cycle
- CONUS Impacts / Timing: The NHC track has been nudged westward at days 4 and 5; it is too soon to know whether, or how, MATTHEW might affect the U.S. east coast.

State Actions
